

Other Mother Hummingbird Night Light - pg 1

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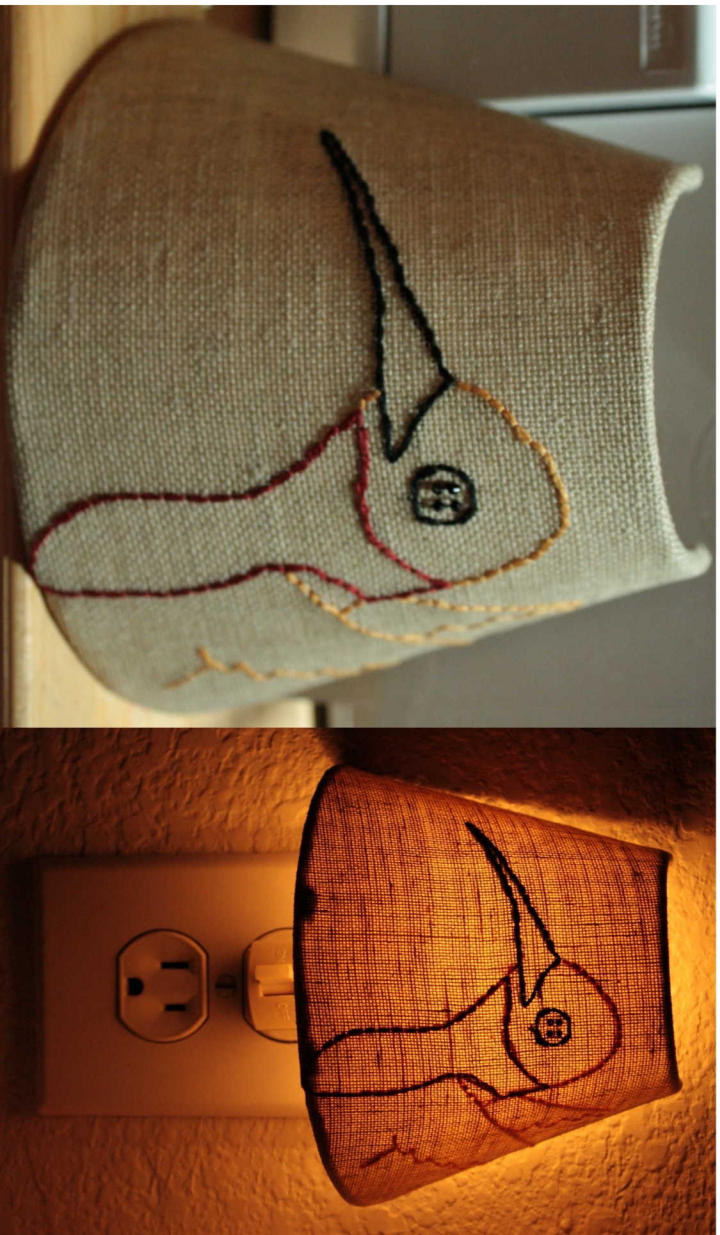
Supply List:

adhesive backed night light kit
fabric glue
old (small) paintbrush
bamboo skewer
Mark-B-Gone pen
10 in. by 6 in. linen foundation
embroidery needle
DMC 783 Md Topaz
DMC 498 Dk Red
DMC Black

Creation and construction:

1. Center pattern under foundation and transfer using Mark-B-Gone pen.
2. Embroider design using a back stitch (french knots for the buttonholes) and three strands of corresponding floss colors. Make sure the stitching is very neat from the front AND the back because you'll see every imperfection when the night light is lit! Wash out Mark-B-Gone pen with cold water, then press foundation with a hot iron.
3. Remove backing from night light shade and center finished embroidery over the shade. Wrap foundation edges around shade frame and mark where the fabric meets the back of the shade. Trim away excess fabric. Coat frame with glue and wrap edges of foundation around the frame, one section at a time. Use the bamboo skewer to tuck raw edges behind the wire frame. Paint a coat of glue over the backside of the frame to reinforce edges. Once the glue is dry, attach the shade to the night light fixture and enjoy!
